The winds ignited several fires in the mountains on Jan 19th. Three that concerned us most were the Autumn Ridge, Manzanita, and Mill Fires. The Autumn Ridge fire was ignited from high winds just above Cascadel in the Creek Fire Scar at approximately 7:38pm and was extinguished very quickly. At 11:32 the Mill Fire ignited near Douglas Ranger Station and Road 225 in the town of North Fork. The fire was contained that night. The Manzanita fire got up to 23 acres and was contained on Jan 20th.



SNOW FALL came in on Sunday Jan 24th – 25th.

Residents reported ten to twelve inches accumulation. On the 25th, the sun came out, and the sky was a beautiful blue, and people were playing in the snow. Snow continued to fall the next few days.



EVACUATION FLOOD WARNING notice came on Jan 26th with the possibility of seven inches of rain from the 26th to 29th. As of Jan 27th we received about one inch

more snow, but no rain. The rains came in on the evening of the 27th thru the morning of the 28th, and then it began to snow again.
