DROUGHT CONTINUES FOR NORTHERN CA

We are entering a second year of low rain and snow levels in the northern counties of California leaving our reservoirs half empty. Sonoma County and the Central Valley growers will be hardest hit with steep cuts in upcoming water deliveries. The Southern counties have enough supplies to carry them through this year and possibly next year as well. According to the LA Times, Governor Newsom is not prepared to declare a Statewide Drought Emergency this year.

We have switched to using the spring, as you know, due to the low levels of water being produced by our wells. It

is possible that we could be restricted with our usage if the levels fall too far below the norm. Until this time, we do ask that you practice water wise use around your home to help prevent the need for a restriction. You should not allow water to run from the hose while washing your cars. Add filled bottles into your toilet tanks to reduce the amount of water used to flush. There are many things you can do to help, and we thank you for your participation in trying to reduce your water usage.
