The county contractor does not do all areas so we will try to get the remaining open area knocked down to prevent wildfires from spotting into tall dead grasses.

FIREWISE BRIGADE NEEDS YOUR HELP

Your Firewise Brigade volunteers are responsible for keeping Cascadel Woods a member in good standing with the National Fire Protection Association (NFPA). This membership makes Cascadel Woods a Firewise USA Community. This status gives us a little bit of a head start when applying for fire prevention grant. When you turn in your hours of clearing and brushing your property, you make it possible for Cascadel Woods to be recognized as a Firewise USA Community.

The Brigade is responsible for arranging events like chipping days, fire hydrant cleaning, setting off burn piles with hose lays for safety and mowing & weedeating tall brown grasses for fuel reduction.

We have five fire boxes placed around the subdivision to help in the event of a fire. We have prevented two different fires from becoming out of control since building these boxes. That is why the boxes were built and saving a home from burning to the ground is worth the cost of the boxes and the equipment stored inside.

We are also in the process of building a new fire box for Cascadel Drive North. With the increased costs of lumber, fuel, and well, everything; we have had to put the construction on hold.

The Firewise Brigade relies completely on your generous donations. No money comes from the Water Company to fund any of our activities. The Firewise Committee put on the BBQ in early Spring, to thank all the volunteers who have helped to burn the huge piles on the open areas and drive the skid steer and to give the community a much needed relaxing affair with awesome BBQ and the best Pot Luck dishes around.

CAL FIRE Peace Officers will be out in full force.

Anyone caught with fireworks will be cited and the fireworks will be confiscated. You could be cited with a \$1,000 fine and up to a year in jail. If large quantities are found you could be fined up to \$50,000 and up to three years in a



California State Prison. It is just not worth the risk. There will be additional personnel and volunteers patrolling areas to keep a watchful eye on all communities this holiday weekend. The various groups patrolling will be CAL FIRE Volunteers in Prevention (VIP's), Peace Officers and Amateur Radio Operators (HAMS). Our resident HAM Operator, Simon Elman usually volunteers his time on the fourth to help keep us safe. Thanks to all the volunteers working this weekend.
