ROAD WORK

Sage Engineering made much needed repairs on Cascadel Road in June.

The easement clearings were started in June. This work will be ongoing as needed through the summer.

ROAD 233 ANNUAL CLEARING EVENT

We live in such a beautiful place. One of the drawbacks to living up here is there is only one way in and out for us all. In 2016, we began clearing the easements on Road 233 to help clear the way for residents to get off the mountain and emergency equipment to get up to protect us.

We have come a long way since 2016 in our clearing efforts.

Last year Cascadel's CMWC Fire Brigade hired the CAL FIRE crew to clear Road 233. This was made possible with the help of generous donations from Cascadel Heights. The crew impressed us all and for the first time in many years and cleared the entire road of tall brown grasses.

This year was even more remarkable. Our Cascadel Heights partners donated \$650 to this event. Cascadel Woods donated as well.

The CAL FIRE crew worked for three days on Road 233. The crew weedeated for two days and removed small brush and downed limbs and trees. We were able to get the county to bring up their chipper to eliminate all the brush piles from the sides of Road 233 to make us as fire safe as possible.

The crew also cleared the easements in Cascadel Heights. We hired Jeff Bouche to haul off the brush from the roadsides in the Heights. Donations covered this expense as well.

The crew finished Cascadel Heights and had some time left in the day so we had them help out with the entrance of Cascadel Woods on the finger of property between Cascadel Drive and Autumn Ridge Way.

The importance of clearing easements on Road 233, the Heights and Cascadel Woods is vital to us all in our fuel mitigation to be as Firesafe as possible each year. We have seen how wildfire is able to be guided away from the cleared areas as proven during the Mission and Creek wildfires.

Thanks, to all who donate each year. You make keeping us safe, a lot easier.

REMINDER

We are now into the summer and it is time to make sure certain things are in place at your Cascadel home and in your vehicle.

A few ideas are:

1. Sign your family members and yourself up for MC Alerts. These alerts can be anything from Heat Advisories to Wildfire Evacuations. You can do this at the following link:

 2. Be sure you have a list of items you must add to your evacuation bag; a) in a moment's notice to evacuate. b) warning of possible evacuation – the extra things you would like to take with you.
3. Does everyone in the home, guests and family members, know where to meet up in the event of an evacuation notice, especially if you are separated from each other?

Remember your pet's needs as well.

For your vehicle

1. Keep plenty of water in your car. Change it out often in the summer time.

2. Keep a phone charger in your car.

3. Place important info on your phone and/or on a flash drive in case you cannot get back home.
