FIREWISE BRIGADE

With the help of volunteers, Graham Guizar, Roger and



Mary Wooten, 17 green posts were placed behind our

fire hydrants.

The posts should blend in during the summer months but stand out nicely during the snow. The posts were placed as close to center and about 16 inches behind each hydrant. This should make locating all hydrants during a snowstorm easier.

The hydrant just before the bridge as you come in from the arches was not marked. There are other posts at this site as well as a telephone box. It should be noted the hydrant is in front of these markers and to the right as you are looking at it from the street.

FREE RED CROSS OFFERS FOR YOU

Resident and Fire Brigade member, Simon Elman, attended two classes with the Red Cross recently. One class was instructions on the procedures to assess properties for preparation of wildfires. The group he was in at this class has been tasked with performing at least 50 home assessments this summer. The assessment team will take about 30 minutes for most properties. This assessment is free to the property owner. Register for this very valuable assessment at www.redcross.org/CCRwildfire.

The other class was on smoke alarm installation and their importance inside the home. The Red Cross is offering an in home visit to educate and install up to three new smoke alarms in your home. The smoke alarm has lithium batteries that last up to 10 years. The visit and smoke alarms are free to the property owner. Register for this visit at www.redcross.org/soundalarm.
