THE CLUBHOUSE IS BACK!

Stan Eggink, (CMWC President), in coordination with Bobby Macaulay, (District 5 Supervisor), Matthew Treber, (County Chief of Development Services), and Wil Van Ryn, (Deputy County Deputy of Community & Economic Development-Building & Fire Safety), requested a meeting to discuss the community's desire to regain access to the clubhouse. On August 26, that meeting was held in the clubhouse.

The attendees representing Cascadel Woods were Stan accompanied by four highly motivated licensed contractors who are also Cascadel property owners: Nate Hodges, Anthony Contino, Matt Contino and David Head, along with two other water company directors, Michael Delaney, VP and Avo Atoian, Treasurer. Alvin Dillard, (County Building Inspector), represented the County.

By the end of the meeting Alvin said he would report that the building was structurally sound to his supervisor where the final decision would be made. The following day Stan received a phone call and a follow-up letter from Wil, stating in part, "Although the structure is old, we conclude that it is sound and is suitable for your events".

The endeavor to regain Clubhouse access actually began several months earlier in negations between the CMWC and Matthew Treber. As a result of those efforts, on July 3, the CMWC received a fully executed Purchasing Agent Agreement to provide maintenance services for CSA-21. The county will now pay for these services from the funds collected through the annual property tax assessments. This agreement eliminates the burden of Cascadel residents to make personal donations to maintain CSA-21, concurrently with their annual tax assessments.

The approximate 47 acres of CSA-21 are designated out lots - A, B, C, & E. The clubhouse is on out lot C. The goal is to make necessary clean up and repairs to the clubhouse as quickly as possible to allow for its, "Official Reopening", and to schedule community events. We are looking for volunteers to assist in this long awaited transitional process.

ANNUAL MEETING & ELECTIONS POT-LUCK

The request for nominees to fill two seats on the CMWC Board of Directors was mailed on August 9. The nominations closed on August 26.

The only nominees were the two incumbents, Stan Eggink and Ken Trapp.

In accordance with Non-profit, Mutual Benefit Corporation Code 7522 (d), if the number of nominees for the board is equal to or less than the number of directors to be elected, the corporation can declare the nominees who are qualified and eligible for election to be elected without further action.

The Annual Membership Meeting will be held on Saturday, September 27, 2025 at 10:00 am in THE CLUBHOUSE!!!!

- AMMONIA
- PINE BASED CLEANERS-PINE SOL

Clean your grill after each use

Put animal feeders away daily

Lock doors, windows, and cars to prevent odors from enticing the strong sense of smell bears have.

Put electrical wires around the perimeter of your chicken coops, bee hives, and other small livestock.

If You Encounter a Bear

- Do not run
- Make yourself look big
- Back away slowly- Do not turn your back on a bear
- Never play dead
- Make a lot of noise
