

REMINDERS

Winter is almost here. Be sure to protect your outside water pipes from freezing.

If you are going to be leaving for more than a few days be sure to shut off your water at the meter box and drain the house from the lowest point outside.

If you turn off your water, it is also suggested that you either turn your water heater off or place it in "vacation" mode. This can prevent over pressurizing the pipes inside your house from the heated water.
