The Firewise Brigade and many resident volunteers have been quite busy clearing fuels from their property and along the easements of our roads and fire hydrants.

Together we have recorded a total of 362 hours of weed eating, chipping, bucking up logs, splitting rounds and decking large logs.

This equates to a value of over \$8,000 of in-kind volunteer credit. Along with the educational Firewise BBQ last month, we have more than covered the necessary requirements to remain certified under National Fire Protection Association, (NFPA). There are some who have not sent in hours but your contributions are very much appreciated and equally important.

Well done to everyone on your fire prevention activities. This year promises to be a hard one in regards to wildfires. So everything you do is a benefit to the entire subdivision and we all thank you for your hard work.

Carol Eggink is also working to provide fuel breaks in the front of the subdivision and other areas to give our first responders a fighting chance should the need arise. She would like to thank everyone for the friendly waves and short talks while she is out there weed eating the tall grasses.
