FIREWISE ANNUAL COMMUNITY BBQ

The CAL FIRE Rancheria Station was unable to attend due to a fire they had been fighting overnight and into that day. Carol Eggink, our Firewise USA Chair, started the meeting off and then introduced the three speakers before enjoying our BBQ.

Jan Quisted, a past resident of Cascadel Woods, now a representative of Citizens on Patrol (COPS), spoke to the crowd on the importance of getting out when asked to evacuate and the importance of getting those GO BAGS ready NOW.



Jose Hernandez of the USFS had an opportunity



to come up the road to Cascadel Point from the Sierra Scenic Byway while trying to get to the Mormon Lightening Fire. He soon found the road was seriously in need of repair. Huge ruts in the road and fallen trees across the road.

Jose spoke to District Ranger, Dan Tunes, and explained the condition

of that road and suggested they repair it so we could have another way off this mountain. Not sure where that will go. We have had this discussion with about four different District Rangers over the years with no help to be given. Jose also reviewed the two lightning fires, Mormon and the Owl Fire. They were both rather small and the crews knocked them out in two days' time.

Jose brought several items to share with children and adults from the USFS.



We were honored to have <u>Frank Bigelow</u>, Deputy Director of Community Wildfire Preparedness & Mitigation and Fire Engineering & Investigations Division, speak on many issues going on in the departments he is responsible for.



Cal Fire has hired more personnel. They now have more helicopters and planes for air drops.

Cal Fire and the Madera County Board of Supervisors are working on an Armadore plan to get our North Fork Station 11 staffed full time. It sounds like when the new bunk house is finished, it could be staffed shortly after. That would mean an engine here full time and during the off season, one member of staff would be on site. During the fire season, at least three staff personnel would be on

site full time. We hope this will happen after this year's fire season is over.

The BBQ was prepared and cooked by Ken Wood.
Those baby back ribs were incredible. We had a great variety for the pot luck dishes and desserts. Our residents can cook up some great dishes for BBQ's. Thanks to all who participated.
